Harvard Law School has renamed a historic classroom “Kirkland & Ellis Hall” in recognition of a \$3 million gift from the Chicago-based law firm.

The financial gift will contribute to the upkeep of the 162-seat space, formerly called the Langdell South classroom, and will support the law school’s general educational and research activities, according to a statement released Tuesday by the law school.

“Harvard Law School is a critical source of lawyers and leadership for Kirkland & Ellis,” Kirkland senior corporate partner **Jack S. Levin** said in the statement. “Kirkland’s many Harvard Law School partners and associates are pleased to give back and positively impact future generations of Harvard lawyers.”

The contribution is the third large gift made to Harvard by Kirkland since the 1960s.
